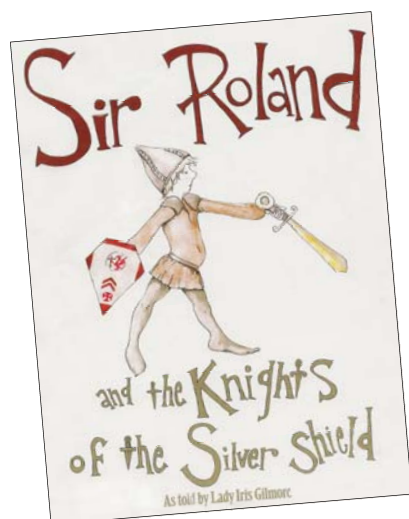


Geneva Glen Camp

Isn’t it odd how much *older* the building looks than it was—13 years?! Remember, this picture was taken during the middle of the Great Depression. If you look closely you can just see the rope wheel in the belfry where the old bell lived for decades!



Alana and Ciara GAY, sisters, and daughters of Kirk, came up with a fabulous venture to reprint the Sir Roland and the Knights of the Silver Shield transcribed from Lady Iris’s version from the video. 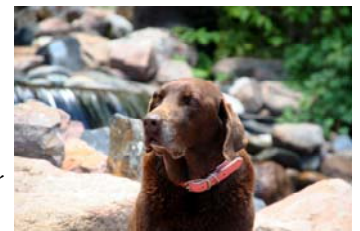

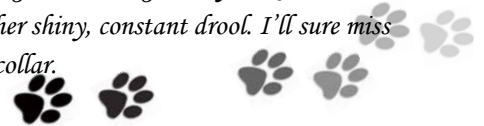
dance and donations from the Patch went to the scholarship fund and the Marathon. Thanks to the great work of the Alumni Committee –
